

About the Wiki

- The word Wiki is new to most of us. It is Hawaiian and means Quick Quick.
- Anyone can use a wiki to create their own website very easily and quickly.
- Wikis are used for collaborating. The point of a wiki is for a group of people to work on a project together.
- Aleco and I have developed a way to use a Wiki for the SDD process. And we call this the Webscope Wiki.





About the Tabs

Every page of the Wiki has TABS along the top.

The 'edit this page' feature is used to create the page. When you edit, you can add text, video, upload pictures, documents, etc...

You will NOT be editing any pages. You will just be using the discussion tab.




Discussion Tabs

The Discussion tab brings you to a page that allows you to post messages to the group.


To post a message (start a thread) simply fill out the short form and click on 'Post'


Launching of the Webscope Wiki

 On December 1, you will begin entering your responses to this triggering question

In the context of Obama's vision for engaging stakeholders from all walks of life in a bottom-up democracy employing Internet technology, what factors do we anticipate, on the basis of our experiences with SDDP, will emerge as inhibitors to the actualization of his vision?

You will use the "Round 1-Responses to Triggering Question" page to enter your responses.

On the Round 1 page, there is a discussion tab just like in the Lounge.




You will enter your responses to the triggering question in the form, one statement at a time.

Enter in the Subject box a brief title that captures the essence of your statement.

Enter in the Message box more detail to explain your statement as clearly as you can.

Click on the "Post" button.


Everyone will enter 3-5 statements.



Round 2 starts Dec. 4th

- Round 2 requires you to read everyone's responses to the triggering question and pose questions for clarification of meaning.
- To make it easier to read everyone's responses the KMT will create a table with everyone's responses, i.e., titles and explanations, and email it to you.
- You will enter your questions for clarification of meaning on the Wiki.
- Even though this is round 2, you will be using the Round 1 page to enter your clarification questions, so that your question stays with the statement.

Rounds 3 and 4

 Directions for Rounds and 3 and 4 are on the Wiki. Please read them over and ask if you have any questions.

- Round 3 begins Tuesday Dec 9th
- Round 4 begins Thursday Dec. 11th

Round 5 will be back here (at GoToMeetings)

- You will receive an invitation to participate in Round 5.
- You will see on my screen the display of a relational question between two ideas that were judged as being relatively more important after the voting (Round 4).
- Your task will be to make a judgment whether the relationship applies (YES), or it does not (NO).
- The majority vote will be entered in the Cogniscope software and a new question will appear on the screen.

Helpful Hint:

- Don't "hit and run" on the wiki.
- During Dec 1-13 you need to make it a habit of checking the Wiki.
- Don't just enter a statement and not check back.
- Don't just enter a clarification statement and not check for their response.
- Be an active participant!
- It just takes a minute for you to check things out, it takes us a long time to get your attention to check things out.
